## Danish Christmas Seals

We are privileged to have a complete collection of Danish Christmas seals to display until later this spring.

Danish Christmas seals were the first in the world. The collection is provided to us on loan for the purpose of display by Max Zollner. Mr. Zollner is an ardent stamp collector and as such

became enamored with the very distinctive Christmas seals of Denmark. This collection is composed of 86 years of seals, some detailing the process for melding several colors into the picture.

According to Wikipedia, "Christmas seals are labels placed on mail during the Christmas season to raise funds and awareness for charitable programs." In the United States, we are very familiar with Easter seals and others that encourage their use to show support for various causes. However, they are not used as postage in any coun-

try. They are sold separately to raise funds for a specific cause. In the case of Denmark, the seals are sold by the Postal Service with the funds used for services for children.

Denmark experienced a severe increase in cases of tuberculosis around 1900, especially effecting children. Einar Holboll, a postal employee, is credited with the idea of stamps being sold to support building a children's TB hospital. He was inspired by the "sight of two ragged appearing children on a stormy night in December 1903. He presented his idea of selling special stamps at Christmas to the Danish Post Office to be affixed along with regular postage.

The idea was presented to King Christian IX who suggested the first seal feature Queen Louise. In 1904, the first year of sales, the Danes purchased 4 million seals raising approximately \$20,000 (\$473,050 in today's dollars) to be used toward the construction of two hospitals for children with tuberculosis. After six

years of sales, there was enough money to build the hospitals. These stamps were the first in the world with the idea spreading to other Scandinavian countries and beyond.

After the first hospitals were completed, the Danish Christmas Seal Committee – today known as Julemærkefonden (the Christmas Seal Fund) decided at that time to put all future collected funds to use in building and operating convalescent homes for children." Christmas seals are still sold and adorn Christmas cards, letters and packages. The process of making the seals is displayed in Mr. Zollner's notebooks which are available for viewing. There are also two letters with stamps that were reviewed by Nazis censors and bear their approval.

Please take time to appreciate this collection and we thank Mr. Zollner very much for sharing them with us. (Information from Wikipedia and Max Zollner's notes)

# Update on Repairs Needed for Pioneer House

In our last newsletter, we alerted you that more repairs are needed to keep our Pioneer House in good shape. We were fortunate that Pam Petersen Pope knew someone, Pat Supak, in El Campo who is an expert in renovating old homes. He has renovated several in El Campo and was willing to come give us his expert advice on what needs to be done.


The repairs that have been recommended include installing a drip cap above the band board running around the bottom of the house, replacing rotten

cypress siding boards with new caulk using a specific caulk. Before painting, thoroughly cleaning the building, applying a sealant, new primer and paint by roller or brush, not spray. It is further recommended that we use a paint that has mildewcide, and eradicate the mold that appears in a few places on the north side window.

Additionally, the porch railing needs to be sanded, repaired with galvanized nails and repainted, replace the bottom board on the windows that don't match and clean and seal the

handicapped walkway. Finally, relocate the tree currently growing in the flower bed.

We are in the process of getting bids and are hoping the project can be completed by next summer. As we have said before, the House is a treasure and an integral part of our campus. Built in 1896, it needs a great deal of constant care and refurbishment.
